Nobel Laureate Amartya Sen



Amartya Sen was born in Santiniketan, Bengal on November 3, 1933. He is an Indian economist and philosopher who has taught and worked in the UK and US since 1972. Sen has made significant contributions to welfare economics, social choice theory, economic and social justice, economic theories of famines, decision theory, development economics, public health, and measures of well-being in countries. Sen began his career as both a teacher and a research scholar in the Department of Economics at Jadavpur University in 1956.

Amartya Sen, a prominent figure in the realms of economics and philosophy, was awarded the Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences in 1998 for his groundbreaking work in welfare economics and social choice theory. This prestigious accolade solidified his status as one of the most influential intellectuals of the 20th century. The Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences stands as a testament to the enduring relevance of his ideas in addressing the most pressing challenges facing humanity.

As the world continues to grapple with complex socio-economic issues, the legacy of Amartya Sen serves as a guiding light, inspiring scholars, policymakers, and activists to strive for a more just and equitable society. Nobel Laureate Abhijit Banerjee



Abhijit Banerjee, born on February 21, 1961, is an Indian American economist renowned for his groundbreaking work in alleviating global poverty. Alongside Esther Duflo and Michael Kremer, he was awarded the Nobel Prize in Economics in 2019 for their experimental approach to tackling poverty. Banerjee earned his bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Calcutta in 1981 and his Ph.D. in economics from Harvard University in 1988. He has held teaching positions at prestigious institutions such as Princeton University, Harvard University, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), where he currently serves as the Ford Foundation International Professor of Economics.

Throughout his illustrious career, Banerjee has received numerous accolades for his contributions to economics. In 2013, he was honored with the John Bates Clark Medal, recognizing him as the best American economist under the age of 40. Additionally, he has been the recipient of prestigious awards such as the Infosys Prize in Social Sciences in 2009, the Albert O. Hirschman Prize from the Social Science Research Council in 2018, and the Padma Shri in 2012. Banerjee's research focuses on poverty, education, and healthcare, reflecting his commitment to addressing some of the most pressing challenges facing humanity. His work continues to shape the field of economics and inspire future generations of scholars and policymakers alike.
