Library with reading room:

A healthy library reflects a healthy academic environment. The college library housed in a separate building has a huge stock of 49,904 books, 1235 reference books and 20 manuscripts. 

B. H. College - A Profile

ORIGIN

The origin of B. H. College dates back to January 1964 when Late Jadab Chandra Das, an eminent citizen, mooted the idea for establishing a College at Howly. Accordingly, a public meeting was held at Howly Chandi Barua Bhawan with Late Abdul Kader Choudhury, (Mouzadar) as President, and, all those who were present very much appreciated the idea and unanimously decided to establish the College at the earliest. It was further decided that the leading persons from different communities of Barpeta Road should also be apprised of the necessity of a College and a joint attempt be made for establishment of an 'Ideal College' in this locality.

A general meeting of the representatives of Howly and Barpeta Road was held on 24-05-1964 at 3 p.m. in the premises of G. N. B. Memorial High School, Barpeta Road, under the presidentship of the then Chairman of Barpeta Road Municipality Board, Mohanlal Choudhury and it was resolved that- "A college, an ideal college, be established with the co-operative efforts of the people of the Howly and Barpeta Road area for meeting the increasing demand for higher education of the people of this locality."

The first general public meeting was held on 12-06-1964 at the G. N. B. Memorial High School premises under the Chairmanship of the then S. D.O. (Civil) Barpeta, Kamal Chandra Majumdar, who galvanized the spirit to see the idea realized.

Noble thoughts may take time to conceive but little time to deliver. In no time, the intense desire and untiring efforts of founding fathers lit the light of B. H. College initially only with Arts faculty in the year 1966. The selfless devotion & sacrifice of the local people have graduated this institution into a famous college in Assam and now it is standing with glory as their cherished offspring.

The opening of the Commerce Stream in 1973 and subsequently Science Stream (H.S.) in 1988, Science Stream (UG) in 1996 and post-graduation in Commerce in 1990, and PG in Assamese and Education in 2018 enabled this institution

to emerge as the only full-fledged three faculty institution in Lower Assam under Gauhati University. The college was accorded UGC recognition in the year 1969 and it had also achieved the distinction of B++ Accreditation by NAAC in 2003. During the session 2015-16 the 2nd cycle of NAAC assessment of B. H. College was completed and Peer Team sent by NAAC visited the college on 28th, 29th & 30th April, 2016. The college was accredited with 'A' (CGPA 3.11) grade by NAAC on 25th May, 2016 which is quite satisfactory for the entire college family and the local public.

The strength of this institution lies in its academic achievements and healthy environment. A rural college, essentially catering to the academic needs of local youth coming from families of cultivators and poverty-stricken multitude, requires a very soft-careful managerial acumen in its build-up process. Our founder Principal Sri Satya Nath Das is the man who did the job with admirable success. The armature of this institution is strong enough to meet the growing challenges of Higher Education.

LOCATION

Historically famous and conveniently situated, Barbarijhar Reserve is the location of the College. This Barbarijhar was originally the capital of Raghudev Rai, the son of Chilaraya, the brother of Koch King Narnarayan. It is situated in the middle point of Barpeta Road and Howly, on the western side of the N.H. 31. The College comprises 33 acres of land shaped in a semi-circular form and bordered by the dead river 'Manas'. The location of the College is far from the din and bustle of towns and cities. Valuable trees and lush-green vegetation lend to the institution a pastoral magnanimity and sylvan serenity. Though sequestered, the location of the College reminds us the concept of 'Sangrilla' or in other-words 'Gurukulashram'.

MISSION AND GOAL

The institution aims at imparting knowledge of various disciplines amongst the youths of rural and semi-urban populace of the region to make them responsible and competent to face the challenges of modern world and contribute towards the uplift of the society.

FYUGP UNDER BHATTADEV UNIVERSITY

Introduction

The university grants commission (ugc) has initiated several measures to bring equity, efficiency and excellence in the higher education system of country. The important measures taken to enhance academic standards and quality in higher education include innovation and improvements in curriculum, teaching-learning process, examination and evaluation systems, besides governance and other matters. But due to the various diversities present in the system of higher education, there are multiple approaches followed by universities towards examination, evaluation and grading system. However, the academic reforms recommended by the UGC in the recent past have led to overall improvement in the higher education system. On the basis of the recommendation, apart from the flexibility and freedom in designing

The examination, there is a need to devise a sensible system for awarding the grades based on the performance of students. the NEP2020 based **Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)**, being adopted by bhattadev university, is an 8-semester (4-year) programme of 160 credits with multiple exit and entry options at the successful completion of courses assigned at the end of each year.

- Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a certificate if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year.
- Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year.
- Students who opt to exit after completion of the third year and have secured 120 credits will be eligible for the bachelor degree in the major discipline without honours.
- Students after completion of the fourth year and have secured 160 credits will be eligible for the bachelor degree with honours in the major discipline.
- Students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

Outline of Courses:

The broad categories of courses and minimum credits required for the 4-year Honours degrees as per the UGC document are as follows:

- 1. Major (Core) course/paper: 80 credits
- 2. Minor course/paper: 32 credits
- 3. Interdisciplinary course/paper (IDC): 9 credits
- 4. Ability Enhancement Course/paper (AEC): 8 credits
- 5. Skill Enhancement Course/paper (SEC): 9 credits
- 6. Value Added Course/paper (VAC): 8 credits
- 7. Summer Internship: 2 credits
- 8. **Research Project/ Dissertation:** 12 credits (for Honours with Research degree)

The following points may be noted:

• In lieu of the Research Project, a student may study 3 courses each of 4 credits (i.e. total 12 credits), leading to an Honours degree (without Research).

- For the 4-year Honours degrees the Major subject/ discipline requires 80 credits and the . Minor subject/ discipline requires 32 credits.
- For a Double Major, the minimum credit requirements are 48 (3-year degree) and 60 (4- year Honours degree) respectively in a subject/ discipline other than the original Major.
- In the UGC framework, papers in Major and Minor disciplines are categorized into levels of 100, 200, 300 and 400. Therefore, a course (paper) offered by a Department, say with 4 credits and of level 200, may be taken both as a Major (Core) course by one student and as a Minor course by another student having a different Major discipline, possibly in different semesters.

Definitions of Keywords:

In FYUGP the terminlogies those are relevant to the B.Sc. curricula have been briefly described below.

Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.

Semester: Each semester will consist of 15 weeks of regular academic work. The odd semester may be scheduled from July to December and even semester from January to June under normal circumstance.

Programme: An educational programme leading to award of a Certificate, Diploma or Degree (B.Sc., B.A., etc.) **Discipline:** This means a particular subject.

Course: Each programme is equipped with a number courses of various disciplines/subjects. The course of a particular discipline/subject refers to the content of the papers the students have to study in that discipline/subject required in obtaining a degree. The courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures /tutorials/laboratory work/ field work/outreach activities/project work /seminars /assignments / presentations etc. or a combination of any of these.

Honours: A particular discipline/subject that a student opts as major subject. (e.g. honours in Physics)

Core Course (CC): A discipline/subject specific compulsory basic course.

Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): A course designed by a department for enhancement of skill of the students in a particular discipline/subject.

Minor Course (M): A course in a discipline/subject corresponding to a subject other than the major subject. **Value Added Course (VAC):** Value-based education to include management of biological resources and biodiversity for the development of humanistic, ethical, sustainable development and living, constitutional, and universal human values of truth, righteous conduct, peace, love, nonviolence, scientific temper, citizenship values, and life skills.

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC): These are compulsory courses. For science programme there will be two of them. AECC-1 is Communicative English & AECC-2 is Environmental Science.

Vocational Course (VOC): A vocational course is focused on practical work, preparing students for a particular trade or skilled profession. These courses are best for students who have a good idea of their career path and want to gain the knowledge to get there.

Levels of Courses:

100 - 199: Foundation or introductory courses.

200 - 299: Intermediate level courses.

300 - 399: Higher level courses.

400 - 499: Advanced courses.

Credit: A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. **Theory/Tutorial classes:** 1 credit = 1 hour / week and **Practical classes:** 1 credit = 2 hours / week

Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.

Letter Grade: It is an index of the performance of students in a said course.

Grade Point: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a certain point scale. The following table explains the above two points

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places. If C_i = credit point in the *i*th course/paper and G_i = grade point obtained by a student in the *i*th course/paper then the grade point average in the *i*th Semeter ie SGPA is given by $S_i = \sum C_i G_i / \sum C_i$

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places. If S_i = Semester Grade point average in the *i*th Semeter, S = total number of semesters in the program, then the cumulative grade point average ie CGPA scored by the student is given by $C = \Sigma S_i / S$

Grade Sheet/Report: Based on the grades earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.

- 1. To develop conscience towards social responsibility, human values and sustainable development through curriculum delivery and extra-curricular activities
- 2. To develop scientific temperament with strong fundamental knowledge of the subject
- 3. To develop analytical thinking and problem-solving skills needed for various entrance and competitive examinations and Post Graduate Studies
- 4. To train students in laboratory skills and handling equipment along withsoft skills needed for placement

The B.Sc. In Physics Program will enable the students;

- 1. To develop basic understanding of Fundamentals of Physics as a discipline.
- 2. To bring thescientific temperament by experiencing the nature and natural phenomena on day to day basis and also increase student competency.

3. To encourage students about applicability of knowledge and Interdisciplinary approach in day todays life and thereby increasing the employability.

Programme Specific Outcomes:

- 1. **Knowledge:** Learners are encouraged to apply the knowledge of mathematics and science fundamentals to various solutions of complex problems. As such, knowledge of the subject is the sole objective of any student learner. A student is exposed to a wide range of topics in various subjects and is given intensive training in each of the courses that have laboratory related work.
- 2. **Problem Analyses:** Well equipped with an understanding of the analytical methods involved, they are in a position to interpret and analyze results so obtained from experiments and draw suitable conclusions against their supported data acquired.
- 3. **Designing Solutions:** Having acquired knowledge of subjects, students are trained to think out of the box, design and conduct an experiment or a series of experiments that demonstrate their understanding of the methods and processes involved. For example, as a part of the project of the final year, students in the subject of Physics are encouraged to calculate the overall power consumption of the institution and think of ways and means of minimizing this consumption through alternate sources of energy.
- 4. **Communication Development:** The medium of instruction being English, proficiency in the subject through English is one of the primary objectives of the science program. In order to improve the writing and oral skills of learners, the program caters to ensuring that learners become effective, clear communicators in written and oral work and are capable of explaining complex issues in accessible terms.
- 5. **Employability:** With our learners long-term professional pursuits being quite varied, many are drawn to careers that require scientific skills or technical expertise or strong quantitative reasoning abilities. Keeping this in mind, the institution apprises students of various employment opportunities that are available in areas of their choice through the Placement cell.
- 6. **Soft-Skill Development:** Apart from the attainment of knowledge and handson skills in practical applicability of the subject, learners need to be equipped with soft-skills and values which will help them function effectively as an individual, and as a member or leader in diverse teams and in multidisciplinary groups.
- 7. **Science and Society:** As an outcome of the course the learners are encouraged to apply logical reasoning based on the knowledge, skills, designing solutions to assess societal, health, safety issues and the responsibilities that go along with the scientific practice.

ATTENDANCE:

CANCELLATION OF SEAT:

A student failing to attend classes for 30 (thirty) days at a stretch shall forfeit his or her seat.

ACADEMIC REGULATIONS:

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS FOR STUDENTS

- 9. Wearing of College Uniform along with black footwear is compulsory during college hours on all working days including days of College Week, Meetings, Examination etc.
- 10. Students entering the College Compound with armed-security is illegal and subject to disciplinary action.
- 11. The decision of the Principal on all matters relating to students shall be final and binding.
- 12. Mobile Phones are strictly prohibited during class and examination hours. Any violation is subject to severe disciplinary action.
- 13. Spitting/ Smoking/ Writing on walls, doors etc. in and around the college building is strictly prohibited. Any student detected doing so, is subject to expulsion from the college.
- 14. Ragging is strictly prohibited.

The department of Assamese was opened in 1966 along with the establishment of the college as Assamese, as a Modern Indian Language (MIL), has been a compulsory subject. Late Girindra Kumar Das, Late Atul Chandra Barman and Sri Golokeswar Goswami were the founder teachers of the department, among whom Prof. Goswami later joined Gauhati University as a faculty. Mrs. Phul Kumari Kalita joined in 1969 and she enjoyed the honour of being the first lady teacher of the college. Along with teaching, she dedicated herself to the collection and preservation of folk songs and various forms of folklore prevalent in the entire lower Assam. She has a good number of books on this subject to her credit. She has been honoured with numerous awards by various societies and organizations including the prestigious Pratima Barua Pandey Award given by All Assam Students' Union in 2010. 

He was initially assisted by Dilip Kumar Das, Nabin Chandra Kalita, Satyen Choudhury, Dr. Dayananda Pathak, Gunindra Nath Choudhury, Kirity Sinha and Rabindra Bhattacharyya. However, D. K. 
